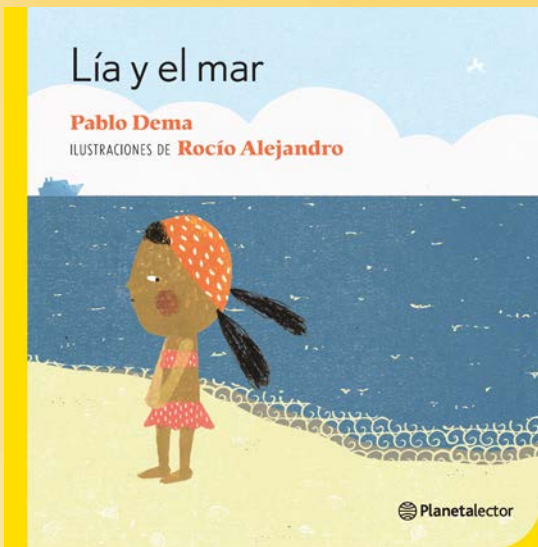

Lía and the sea have a strong, intense relationship that rises and falls down like waves do. Or like life itself.

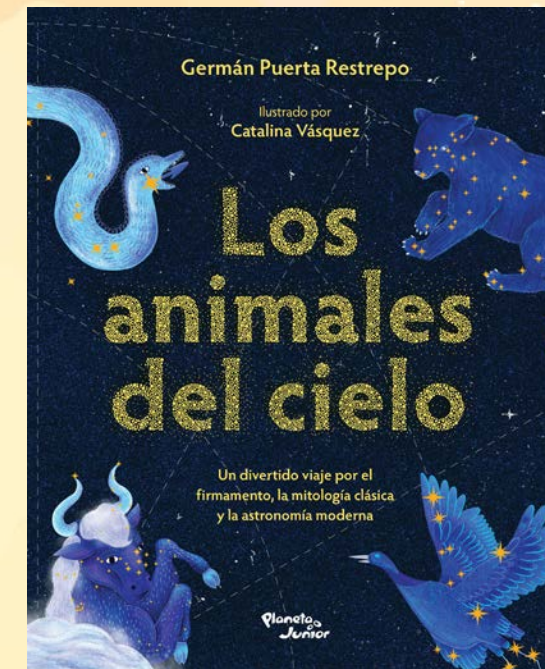

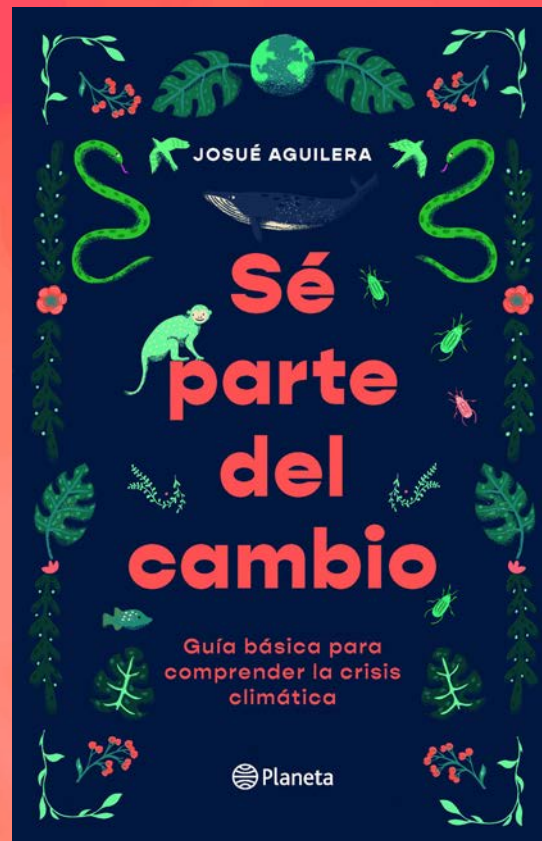






## ★ Be Part of the Change

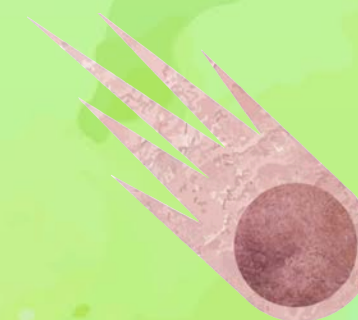
## ★ Mysterious Jungle
